More than 60% of Wilmington's youth have experienced some form of trauma. Almost 30 percent of youth have experienced trauma more than once.*

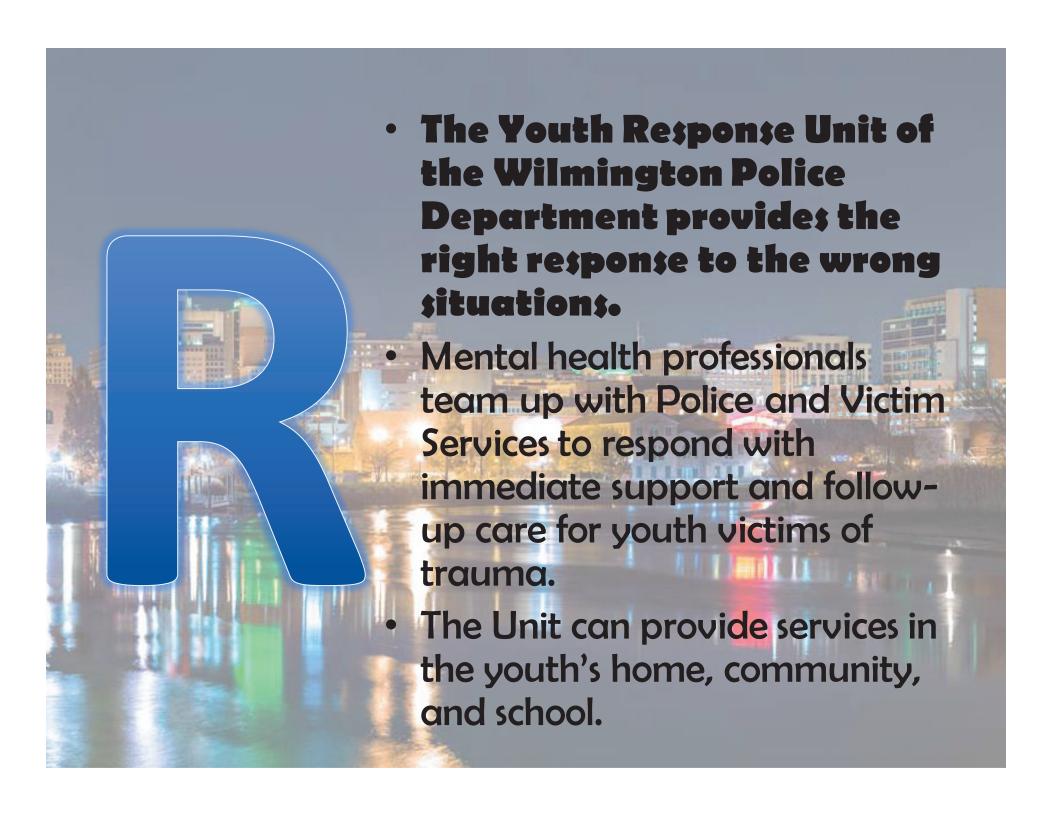
From 2011-2016, 43% of Wilmington's shooting victims were between the ages of 16 and 24.**

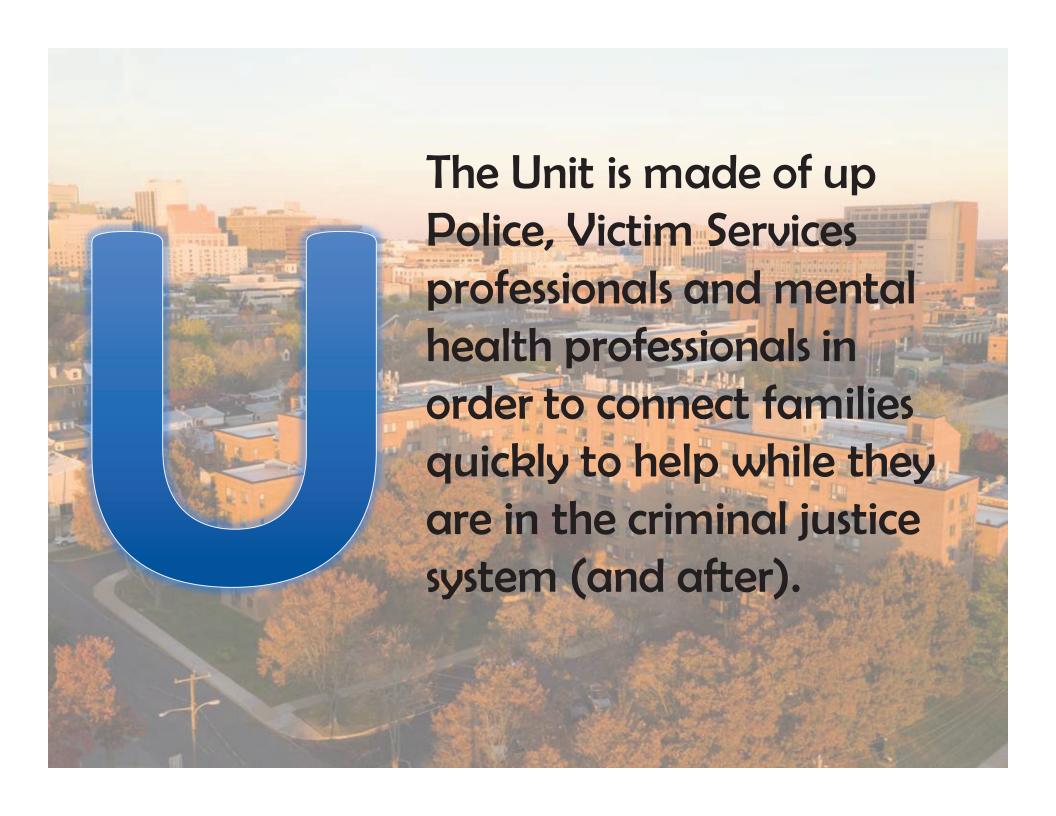

What to look for...

Trauma in youth can look like: "Acting out", Anger outbursts, crying, feeling sad or depressed, keeping to themselves, bad dreams, flashbacks, looking out for danger, bedwetting, stomach aches, headaches, anxiety, difficulty in school, being clingy with parents.
